SUPPORT MEMBER PRIORITIES & PRIMARY CARE SYSTEM

- Supported 11 physician-led project meetings, including a high-risk maternity clinic visioning session to develop a proposal, as well as an Addictions Medicine project kick off meeting.
- Received the PCN approval and funding letter for 82 FTE of net new clinical resources for the Thompson Region.
- Approval for the new Long-term Care Initiative On Call Availability and Quality Improvement funding.
- Invited to participate in the inaugural Indigenous PCN Task Force in the community of Simpow.
- Onboarded three new PCN-designated staff: Sarah Graham, PCN Manager; Ross Gibson, PCN Implementation Manager; and Sherry Westgarde Hepper, PCN Administrative Assistant.
