## 1. SUPPORT MEMBER PRIORITIES & PRIMARY CARE SYSTEM


- Hosted an in-person Indigenous Cultural Safety & Humility Learning Day with opening prayer from local Elder Freda Jules, and speakers Nicole Williams and Harley Eagle, for almost 30 attendees including physicians, NPs, midwives, and Division staff.
- A new provider joined Long-Term Care which enabled an additional 20 LTC beds to be filled. Dr. Phil Sigalet, local LTC co-lead, joined the FPSC LTC working group to inform provincial work.
- In Q4, the number of providers with complete profiles in the Provincial Attachment System increased from 26 to 48, with an additional 1200 patient attachments reported. Great news!
- The Shared Care **Eating Disorders working group** presented to SD 73 high school counsellors.

- PCN Engagement moved ahead with PAS

   Health Hubs, a new live PCN Dashboard, and website updates.
